

**BARNYARD BUDDIES** is a half-day camp for our youngest campers, ages 3-5. There are 2-day and 3-day sessions all summer and various themes to choose from. Small groups and trained, experienced staff (8 campers per 1 staff member) create a nurturing, hands-on environment where our campers can try new things, explore the animals, investigate the gardens and grounds, and make new friends.

Little Sprouts campers will get "down in the dirt" and investigate our gardens, help with planting, weeding, and harvesting. They will create tasty treats from the bounty they collect. Campers will also learn about the food our farm animals eat and help with the feeding chores.



**Farm Friends** is a great introduction to a full day camp schedule. During this Kindergarten prep program, Campers will gain important social skills while they enjoy the excitement of being on a working farm. We'll learn to care for the farm's plants and animals while creating new connections with their peers. Campers are divded into groups of 10 children per adult Group Leader.

We provide a safe, welcoming, and inclusive space for all campers to experience authentic learning, build relationships with their peers, and try something new! Activities are mindfully created to provide campers with a deeper understanding of the connections between agriculture, the natural world, and our community. Each day includes animal interactions. Camps for this age group reflect the spirit of choice and independence.

#### **FARMER IN TRAINING**

Discover the farmer in you! This program is for campers who are ready to dive deeper into their farm knowledge and experience. Farmers in Training (FITs) will work alongside camp and farm operations staff and learn the ins and outs of caring for a farm: supporting animal care and completing farm-based projects. FITs should be eager to get dirty, use tools, spend a majority of their day outdoors and challenge themselves. This is a "chore" heavy camp which includes engaging in non-glamorous tasks such as cleaning animal pens! In ALL camp sessions campers engage in farm chores (animal care: feeding, cleaning pens, grooming), visit and work in the garden, and cook in the garden kitchen

#### **COOKING + CLIMBING**

9a - 3:30p \$435 / session

July 22-26 Aug 12-16

This is a session for those looking for a provoking challenge. Campers will divide their time between the Challenge Course and the Bowers Bistro. In the woods, campers will engage in ground games, low ropes, and ascend up into the treetops. Those up to the challenge will have the opportunity to zip-line. In a complementary experience, campers will explore and practice a variety of cooking models ranging from over-the-fire primitive cooking to refined and precise in the kitchen techniques.
